

**ANSONIA-DERBY, CONNECTICUT  
HOUSATONIC RIVER BASIN FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT**

Condition of Improvement, 30 September 1984

TYPE: Local Flood Protection - structural

LOCATION: The project is located along the Naugatuck River, in the cities of Ansonia and Derby, New Haven, County, Connecticut.

AUTHORIZATION: Authorized by Congress on 23 October 1962 by the Flood Control Act of 1962.

PROTECTED AREA: The project is an integral part of the coordinated system for flood protection in the Naugatuck River Valley. It provides protection to 440 acres of highly developed residential, commercial and industrial property in Ansonia and Derby.

PROJECT FEATURES: The project includes 13,000 feet of channel improvements, 10,400 feet of earth dikes, 5,600 feet of floodwalls, 4 pumping stations, 4 railroad and 5 street swing gates and 1,400 feet of pressure conduits along the Naugatuck River and Beaver Brook. Project design flood is 75,000 cfs for the Naugatuck River and 2500 cfs for Beaver brook.

LOCATION COOPERATION: Operated and maintained by the city of Ansonia Connecticut.


