

SEBASTICOOK RIVER, HARTLAND, MAINE

Condition of Improvement, 30 September 1984

TYPE: Local Flood Protection - structural

LOCATION: Project is located on the Sebasticook River, in Hartland, Somerset County, Maine.

AUTHORIZATION: Authorized by the Chief of Engineers on 9 March 1982 through Section 205 of the Flood Control Act of 1948.

PROTECTED AREA: The project protects a tanning company from the Standard Project Flood. The project also provides protection to residential and commercial properties from the 100-year flood.

PROJECT FEATURES: The project includes a system of earth dikes and floodwalls to protect a major tanning company, removal of the Right Mill Dam and construction of an earth dike across the bypass channel to protect residential and commercial properties. The project also includes the construction of a water supply pipeline to ensure continued fire protection and process water. Project design flood is 8,000 cfs.



